News Release

On December 30, 2008 the City of Beverly Hills began a 30-day warning period for photo red light enforcement at the intersections of Sunset Blvd at Hillcrest Drive (both directions), westbound Olympic Blvd at Roxbury Drive, and eastbound Olympic Blvd., at Spalding Drive. For this 30-day period, notices of warning will be sent to the registered owners of vehicles captured on camera committing red light violations. At the end of this warning period, actual notices of violation will be issued by the Police Department.

Redflex Traffic Systems, of Scottsdale, Arizona, have been contracted to provide services related to this program. The camera system provided by Redflex has been in use in Beverly Hills at other intersections for over one year. The new equipment provides digital video and still images, allowing for greater coverage of turning violations and quicker transfer of the information. In addition to receiving the photos by mail, alleged violators will be able to view a password protected video clip on the company's website.

“All of the violation notices are reviewed, approved and issued by a police officer with the Beverly Hills Traffic Bureau,” said Lieutenant Tony Lee. If you have any questions regarding this program or any other traffic safety issue, please contact the Traffic Bureau at 310.285.2190.
